is the approximate percentage of new housing built or approved over the last five years that is affordable.*

of an early child care worker's income would be needed to afford a 2 bedroom rental apartment in Toronto.

* Affordable rental housing means housing where the total monthly shelter cost is at or below the average City of Toronto rent as reported annually by the Canada Mortgage and Housing Corporation.

Housing Now will create a mix of affordable rental, market rental and ownership housing options to serve Toronto residents.

The affordable homes are targeted to provide housing for Torontonians earning between approximately **\$21,000** and **\$52,000** per year. That includes the early child care workers, receptionists, dental assistants, and employment counsellors who work in Toronto but cannot always afford to live here.

The new affordable rental homes will remain affordable for 99 years, providing quality housing for future generations.
