- Obtaining input and comments from the Indigenous community that will refine the final design

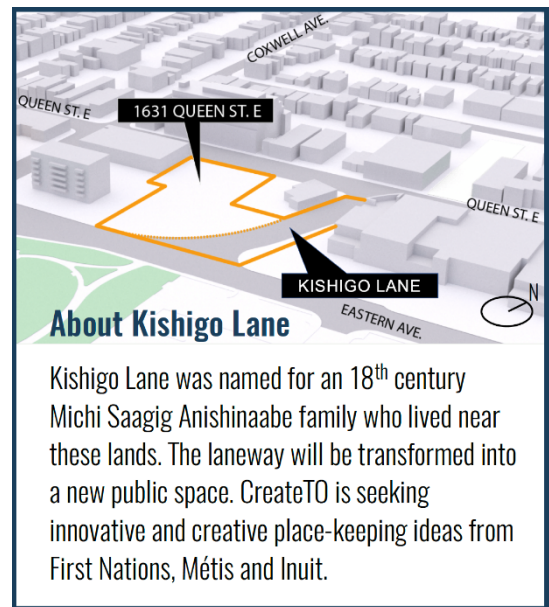
